Shah: No benefit to country, Kashmir from Article 370

UNION HOME Minister Amit Shah said Sunday that he had "no confusion" in his mind about the removal of special status under Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir, which was of "no benefit to the country...or for Kashmir".

Reiterating his argument in Parliament that the government's decision will put an end to terrorism in the state and lead to development, Shah said: "As a legislator there was no confusion in my mind about the decision... I firmly believe there was no benefit to the country from it, or for Kashmir. It should have been removed much before. As Home Minister, I had no confusion on what will happen after Article 370."

Shah was speaking at an event to mark the release of the book "Listening, Learning & Leading..." on Vice President M Venkaiah Naidu's two-year term in office.

Speaking at the event, Naidu said the abrogation of Article 370 was in "national interest". "It was the need of the hour, people of the country should stand with

Jammu and Kashmir... We should all think in terms of national interest rather than party interest. This should not be treated as a political issue but as a national issue as Kashmir is an integral part of India," he said.

"Whatever problems are faced by the people of Kashmir, we have to stand by them and assuage their feelings and see to it that steps are taken to restore normalcy," Naidu said.

Union Minister Prakash Javadekar, who participated in

the event, claimed that Kashmir has been peaceful after the government's decision. "Not even a single teargas shell has been fired," he said.

Shah, meanwhile, praised the Vice-President's handling of the Rajya Sabha as its Chairman on the day the Jammu and Kashmir decision was taken up in the Upper House. Shah said his apprehension was whether it would lead to ugly scenes similar to those during the bifurcation of Andhra Pradesh.

"We do not have such a majority there (Rajya Sabha)... Still I decided that I will take it to the Rajya Sabha first and then Lok Sabha... It was the appropriate handling of affairs of the House by him (Naidu)... I want to acknowledge his efficiency in handling the affairs of the House," Shah said.

Meanwhile, Tamil movie superstar Rajinikanth, who spoke at the event, praised Shah for his role as Home Minister on Article 370. "My heartfelt congratulations for his Mission Kashmir operations. The way you conducted it, hats off. The speech you delivered in Parliament was fantastic. Now people have come to know who is Amit Shah. I am happy about that," Rajinikanth said.

"So Amit Shah ji and Modi ji are like the Krishna-Arjuna combination. We don't know who is Krishna, who is Arjuna, they only know," he said.

Rajinikanth had announced his plan to enter politics early last year but has since delayed action on the ground. On Saturday, DMK and other Opposition parties in the state had demanded that the Centre take a delegation of their leaders to Jammu and Kashmir to "assess the real situation" there.

Indian envoy to Pak Ajay Bisaria returns

INDIAN HIGH Commissioner to Pakistan Ajay Bisaria has returned to India, days after Islamabad expelled him following its decision to downgrade diplomatic ties over the withdrawal of special status to Jammu and Kashmir.

Sources said Bisaria is back in Delhi as Pakistan did not heed to India's request to review its decision to downgrade diplomatic ties.

Pakistan has already made it clear that it will not send its newly-appointed High Commissioner Moin Ul Haque to India. Haque was appointed to the post three months after the previous Pakistani envoy Sohail Mahmood took charge as Pakistan's foreign secretary. It is learnt that Bisaria left Islamabad on Saturday and arrived here via Dubai.

Pakistan on Wednesday expelled Bisaria, soon after deciding to downgrade diplomatic ties with India over what it called New Delhi's "unilateral" decision on Jammu and Kashmir.

India on Monday revoked provisions of Article 370 of the Constitution, withdrawing special status to Jammu and Kashmir, and bifurcated the state into two Union Territories — Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh.

On Thursday, India urged Islamabad to review its decision to downgrade diplomatic ties with it. The external affairs ministry said India regretted the steps announced by Pakistan, asserting its decision on Jammu and Kashmir was an internal affair.

India has been maintaining that its decision on Jammu and Kashmir was an internal affair aimed at ensuring overall welfare of the region.

"It is not surprising that such developmental initiatives that could address any disaffection in Jammu and Kashmir should be negatively perceived in Pakistan, which has utilised such sentiments to justify its cross-border terrorism," the Ministry of External Affairs said on Thursday.

Don't cancel Indo-Pak trains, hamper peoples' ties: Passengers to authorities



103 Pakistanis reached in India on Sunday on Thar Express

Railway Minister Sheikh Rashid Ahmed on August 9 announced in Islamabad that the day's train would be the last one to Jodhpur.

Even as the people of the two countries dared to take the international train to reach out to their relatives in the neighbouring country, the uncertainty over its fate bothered quite a few of them, prompting some of the Indians to cut short their stays and return to their respective countries.

"I had gone to Pakistan to see my relatives on a two month visa but decided to return considering the uncertainty over the fate of the Thar Express," said Gautam from Jodhpur.

Gautam came back with one month left in expiry of his visa.

Similarly, Chetan also came back 15 days before his visa to Pakistan was to expire. He returned fearing that the international train service might be hit in the troubled times between the two countries.

None of them, however, complained about any force or pressure on them to leave Pakistan.

"Everything was normal there," he said.

While taking to the media, Indian septuagenarian Farookh, who had gone to Lahore to celebrate Eid with his sister on a 45-day visa but returned in just 15 days, said there was no turbulence in Pakistan after revocation of Jammu and Kashmir's special status by India, but prices of essential commodities have gone up a bit there, apparently in anticipation of some trouble in the country.

RAILWAYS CANCELS SAMJHAUTA EXPRESS

WITH PAKISTAN stopping it in light of "security concerns" a few days ago, Indian Railways on Sunday cancelled the Samjhauta Express from its side, which was scheduled to leave Sunday.

The "link" express train, that took passengers to Attari from where passengers could board the train to Pakistan, stands cancelled. The link express had two passengers booked on it, railway officials said.

"In consequent to Pakistan's decision to cancel Samjhauta Express 14607/14608 running between Lahore and Attari... the link express train number 14001/14002 running between Delhi and Attari also stands cancelled," said Deepak Kumar, Chief Public Relations Officer of Northern Railway.

Pakistan suspended the Samjhauta Express and the Thar Express trains amid tensions between the two neighbouring countries after the government revoked the special status of Jammu and Kashmir and divided the state into two Union territories.

In separatist stronghold Sopore: 'Don't misunderstand our silence as surrender'

A SEPARATIST stronghold and red zone on the militancy map of Kashmir, Sopore is silent. Away from the gaze of paramilitary personnel, its men, young and old, are engaged in an animated conversation — they talk about the politics of Article 370, India and Pakistan.

"We are quiet but don't misunderstand our silence as surrender," says Altaf Ahmad, 38, a resident of Noorbagh in Sopore. "This silence is strategic. They want us to react. But we know; it is a long battle ahead."

As Ahmad talks, 73-year-old

Nazir Ahmad joins in. "They (government) have put everything in place. They want us to react," he says. "We should be sensible and wait for the time of our choosing. We have to take them by surprise."

The people of Sopore are angry and they say the response would be damaging. "For all these years, if a tourist or a non-Kashmiri was killed by the militants, we felt bad. We apologised for every intentional and unintentional killing of a tourist or anybody from outside," says Rashid Nabi, a college student. "Now for us, every tourist or a non-Kashmiri labourer is a potential settler..."

While on Saturday, the government eased out restrictions

in many parts of the Kashmir valley, the roads of Sopore, the home town of Hurriyat leader Syed Ali Shah Geelani, continued to be barricaded and Army allowed only selected vehicles to move.

While the people are preparing for a long haul, they are looking towards Pakistan as well. "It may be a blessing in disguise for us. After almost 50 years, Kashmir is back on the international agenda," says a Kashmir University student from Arampora Sopore. "We are sure that Pakistan would intervene. They have no other choice — they have either to intervene or forget Kashmir."

Twenty kilometres from Sopore, Baramulla is deceptively

calm. The people say they are tired of the daily battles of life and want a final solution. "We are waiting for what will happen at the UN. If nothing comes out, we would welcome Pakistan to wage a war. It is better to die once than die every day," says Ghulam Hassan, a 56-year-old resident of the town.

Some, like Ibtisam Nabi, take a positive out of the developments; the decimation of the mainstream in the valley. "They (mainstream) played the buffer between New Delhi and Kashmir. New Delhi used them to get a strong foothold here," says Nabi. "It is good for us that the buffer is gone. It would be a direct fight between Delhi and Kashmir."

My family descended from Lord Ram's son Kush: Diya Kumari

BJP LAWMAKER Diya Kumari, a member of the erstwhile Jaipur royal family, claimed on Sunday that her family has descended from Lord Ram's son Kush, days after the Supreme Court sought to know whether anyone from the 'Raghuvansha' was still residing in Ayodhya.

She said descendants of Lord Ram are all over the world and the dispute in Ayodhya should be resolved soon.

"Court has said where are the descendants of Lord Ram... Descendants of Lord Ram are all over the world, including our

family who descended from his son Kush," Kumari, the MP from Rajasmand in Rajasthan, said.

She said that her comments were based on manuscripts, genealogy and documents available with the royal family.

Curious to know whether anyone from the 'Raghuvansha' (descendants of Lord Ram) was still residing in Ayodhya, the Supreme Court on Friday had put this query to 'Ram Lalla Virajman', the deity and one of the parties in the politically sensitive Ram Janmabhoomi-Babri Masjid land dispute case.

A five-judge Constitution bench headed by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi had asked the question to senior advocate T

Parasaran, appearing for 'Ram Lalla Virajman', when he was arguing that the deity and the birth place both were "juristic

entities and hence, capable of holding properties and instituting lawsuits.

"We are just wondering if

anyone from the 'Raghuvansha' dynasty is still living there (at Ayodhya)," the bench had said.

"I have no information. We will try to find it out," Parasaran had responded.

Kumari said, "Everyone has faith in Lord Ram. It is our request that hearing in the Ram temple case should be expedited and the court give its verdict soon."

She said that if needed she will present documents proving links of her family to Kush in the court, but will not interfere in the Ayodhya case by taking a lead.

The law suit filed by the deity in the case has also made the birth place of Lord Ram as competitor and has sought claim

over the entire 2.77 acre of disputed land at Ayodhya where the structure was razed on December 6, 1992.

Fourteen appeals have been filed in the apex court against the 2010 Allahabad High Court judgment, delivered in four civil suits, that the 2.77-acre land in Ayodhya be partitioned equally among the three parties — the Sunni Waqf Board, the Nirmohi Akhara and Ram Lalla.

On December 6, 1992, the Babri Masjid, constructed at the disputed site in the 16th century by Shia Muslim Mir Baiqi, was demolished.

The Supreme Court is currently holding day-to-day hearing in the case.
